DAC Workgroups Overview

Membership Workgroup

The purpose of this workgroup is to develop a standardized process for identifying and engaging a diverse group of diabetes professionals to join the NC DAC as either stakeholders or voting members.

Activities may include:

- 1) Developing a member survey to send to multi-disciplinary networks or organizations,
- 2) Assist the NC DAC leadership team in increasing awareness of the Council to individuals and organizations that are involved in diabetes care, education and advocacy.

This group would also identify gaps in our membership against the list of member representatives desired and then reach out to those orgs to request representation.

Abstract Workgroup

The purpose of this workgroup is to develop a standard presentation including talking points and handouts for any NC DAC representatives who are interested in submitting abstracts to state, national or international meetings or conferences.

Interest Survey Workgroup

The purpose of this workgroup is to develop an interest survey for current NC DAC voting members and stakeholders to identify professionals who desire to:

- 1) Continue to serve as voting members
- 2) Move from serving as stakeholders to voting members,
- 3) Increase involvement in the NC DAC by leading or participating in new workgroups, or
- 4) Present on current or future diabetes work during upcoming NC DAC meetings or other state or national professional meetings

Reminder: Changes to the by-laws

- Majority of suggested changes are related to changing language from stakeholders to collaborators (<u>stakeholders language</u>)
- Other changes include changing "removal" to "involuntary termination" and similar language adjustments



Membership Expectations

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings (out of 3) annually, in-person or virtually, and vote on matters brought forward
- Serve as a sponsor to a new member and provide a brief orientation to the NC DAC
- Communicate with the co-chairs if there is any change in affiliation
- All current members will be expected to participate in one or more of the following:
 - Committee/workgroup
 - Arrangement of or present to the NC DAC at a meeting



Membership Expectations: Onboarding

- Upon acceptance of membership, new members:
- Will commit to attending a minimum of 2 meetings (out of 3) annually upon selection of membership
- Be paired with an existing member who will serve as a sponsor.
 - Sponsors can be chosen by new members or assigned by leadership
- Review the bylaws and connect with sponsor for more information



Membership Committee

- New membership applications will be reviewed by the membership committee in the fall (pilot the process)
- Onboarding "package"
 - Welcome letter
 - Bylaws and policy documents
 - List of existing members
 - North Carolina's Guide to Diabetes Prevention and Management
 - Relevant websites (DSMES and DPP)



Membership Expectations: Retention

All members will serve for three-year terms. At the end of the three-year term, an NC DAC representative will reach out to confirm renewal of membership. If a member decides to leave the NC DAC, they will notify the co-chairs of the NC DAC by email. If a member is a part of a membership organization, they will nominate a replacement prior to their departure for the approval of the membership committee.



Representation

- NC Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities
- Representatives of organizations focused on diabetes prevention and management (community coalitions, community health workers, etc.)
- NC Quality Improvement Organization
- Faith-Based Organizations
- NC Office of Rural Health
- PPOD+A groups: Pharmacy, Podiatry, Optometry, Dental and Audiology
- Person(s) with Diabetes- we have several current members who have diabetes, but worth considering having a community member who can provide perspective outside of the healthcare field

Section 4: Term of Membership

- 1- The initial term of membership for the NC DAC shall be a three-year tenure. Upon completion of the tenure of office, NC DAC members may be re-appointed by the Co-Chairs for additional 3-year terms, or may choose to retire. There are no term limits for members.
- 1. All members will serve for three-year terms. At the end of the three-year term, an NC DAC representative will reach out to confirm renewal of membership. If a member decides to leave the NC DAC, they will notify the co-chairs of the NC DAC by email. If a member is a part of a membership organization, they will nominate a replacement prior to their departure for the approval of the membership committee.
- 2. If a member resigns and a new member is appointed to complete the term, they will serve the remainder of that term and then are eligible for re-appointment.
- 3. There are no terms or term limits for liaison members or stakeholders collaborators.
- 4. Termination of Membership
 - a) Any member may resign by giving written notice to the presiding Co-Chairs to be effective upon receipt or at any later date specified in the notice.
 - b) Removal
 - 1. When a NC DAC member is absent from more than two NC DAC meetings in a one-year period, without due cause or prior notification, the NC DAC Co-Chairs may send a letter to that member to determine his/her commitment to the NC DAC membership. The NC DAC Co-Chairs may also remove the member from the NC DAC if there continues to be a lack of participation.
 - 2. Any member's NC DAC appointment may be rescinded if the NC DAC member does not abide by the COI policy or it is determined a flagrant COI exists.



Section 5: Onboarding of New Members

Upon acceptance of membership, new members:

- a. Will commit to attending a minimum of 2 meetings (out of 3), in-person or virtually, annually upon selection of membership
- b. Be paired with an existing member who will serve as a sponsor. Sponsors can be chosen by new members or assigned by leadership
- c. Review the bylaws and attend a brief orientation meeting with their sponsor

Section 6: Expectations of Members

- 1. Attend a minimum of 2 meetings (out of 3) annually, in-person or virtually, and vote on matters brought forward
- 2. All current members will be expected to participate in one or more of the following:
 - a. Subcommittee/workgroup
 - b. Arrangement of or present to the NC DAC at a meeting
- 3. Serve as a sponsor to a new member and provide a brief orientation to the NC DAC
- 4. Communicate with the co-chairs if there is any change in affiliation

Hugh Young Diabetes Care and Education Specialist Scholarship


Recognizes a diabetes care and education specialist with a one-time financial award to participate in a diabetes specific training or conference.
